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replacing or installing a new bus shelter is now, as a part of the work, also obliged to pay for the installation of heightened kerbs. It has been estimated that, on average, this would add around another £2500 & VAT to the overall cost of a project (more on a road like Green Road which would also require traffic management). Councillors felt that this is a huge disincentive for maintaining, updating or providing new shelters. The officer was going to double-check that this requirement would be necessary at the two locations in Wivelsfield Green where the Council had been considering replacing/introducing bus shelters. The officer had suggested that one alternative for the proposed bus shelter along Eastern Road would be to install it in the Village Hall car park. This would remove the need for a highways licence or kerb works. The Clerk cautioned that (apart from needing the consent of the Management Committee) there would be a need to ensure that a shelter would not impede view lines for any vehicles coming in or out of the car park and would be sufficiently visible (even in the dark) to prevent someone from driving into it. The Council agreed that this project will be put on hold until after work on the Hall Improvement Project is complete, as the bottom end of the car park will be inaccessible anyway for the duration of the work. No further decisions will be made about progressing with replacing the

shelter on Green Road until a definitive answer about additional costs of kerbing work is obtained from East Sussex Highways.

- b To discuss the IT support company's recommendation to have a Cyber Essentials review – on the basis that the Council has an IT contract which monitors IT security and ensures that software and anti-virus protection etc is up-to-date, the Council felt it was unnecessary to seek Cyber Essentials accreditation.
- Need to replace defibrillator batteries at a cost of £176 each it was agreed c to replace the four defibrillator batteries as they have reached the end of their warranty period.
- d Initial indication of results of impact absorption testing at the play area (awaiting full report) – initial indications from an email from the inspector were that the results were all within accepted levels and deemed to be low risk.
- e <u>Annual Parish Meeting (APM) – updated information</u> – the latest information received from the County Association has advised planning to hold this year's APM virtually. It was agreed to decide on a provisional date in May and to make tentative arrangements for speakers to attend, including: a representative from the Ouse & Adur Rivers Trust to speak about surface water flooding mitigation measures in Wivelsfield Green; someone representing the contractor for the Hall Improvement Project, to talk about progress with this; someone from WelMedical to demonstrate how to use a defibrillator and perhaps someone (eg Trevor Leggo from SSALC) to discuss how things are with the planning system now.

f Request from the Church for Councillors to be included on a rota as stewards for supervising a book of condolence in the event of the death of a senior royal - stewarding duties will include supervising the book of condolence and advising people where flower tributes should be laid. Several councillors agreed to be included in the rota. The Clerk to forward their contact details to the Church Wardens.

Request from the Church to consider paying for or contributing to, the cost of a memorial bench for those from the Parish that have lost their lives through coronavirus – the Council agreed to contribute £100 towards the purchase of a bench, to recognise the profound impact of coronavirus on
